- Chip Ridge Plans and Contract Documents have been reviewed and approved by VDH. <u>Staff would like to ask the</u> <u>Boards permission to advertise the Chip Ridge Project.</u>
- Rich Valley Road Staff had environmental Public Hearing at WCSA on Dec. 12th, no comments for project. Work will be finalizing plans in early 2018.



FY-2018 Water Line Extension Projects

- Sugar Cove Road Staff is working with TLG on proposed pump station site and hydraulics. Will be working on easements in upcoming month.
- <u>Hidden Valley Phase 2</u> Staff continues to work with property owner for proposed well site.
- Working with Mount Rogers Planning District on Pre-Contract Items for the DHCD Grant.



- Lee Highway Corridor Sewer Project 50% PER—
- Staff has received the 50% PER from TLG and T&L.
- Staff is reviewing the Preliminary Engineering Reports (PER's).
- PER's so far are suggesting as much as 70% grant needed to be able to cash flow the project.
- Staff will be providing final comments to Engineer and determine next step of moving forward.


