Statements of Qualifications will be evaluated based on the criteria included in the RFSOQ. The evaluation criteria, selection process, phases of the process, and deliverables are set forth in detail in the RFSOQ. The RFSOQ will contain skill sets required for these services.

WCSA reserves the right to award future construction administration / post construction services to the firms or individual.
